

# How to Refer to Kerry South SCP project.

The SCP is a targeted support for those children and young people most at risk of educational disadvantage through early school leaving.

Children and young people who are identified as requiring a targeted support must be referred to the SCP using the SCP Referral Form. Parental consent to refer to the SCP must also be obtained.

The Home School Community Liaison coordinator in each school is responsible for supporting teachers in obtaining parental consent and completing the referral form.

Not every child or young person who is referred will receive a support.

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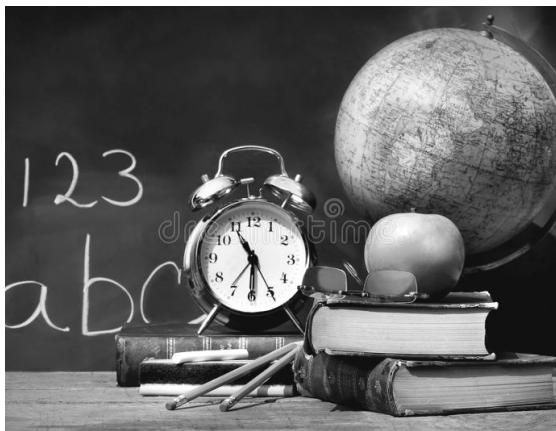

## What is the School Completion Programme?

The School Completion Programme (est. 2002) is a targeted programme which aims to increase the numbers of children and young people staying in primary and post primary school and in doing so improve the numbers of young people who successfully complete the Senior Cycle, or equivalent. The primary focus of the Programme is to work with those identified as being at risk of educational disadvantage through early school leaving.

The SCP aims to impact positively on school:

- Attendance;
- Retention; and
- Participation.

The SCP is a national programme, and an action under the Department of Education & Skills DEIS – ‘Delivering Equality of Opportunity in School’ Plan (2005 / 2017). The SCP is funded by the Educational Welfare Services, Tusla.

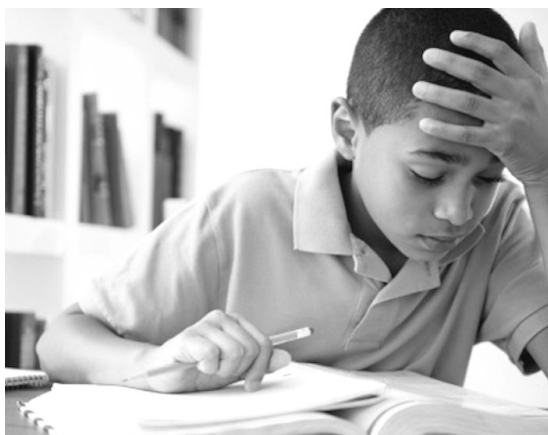
## Who is SCP for?

The SCP works with children and young people in primary school, post primary school and in out of school settings who may be at risk of educational disadvantage through leaving school early.
